A Proclamation By th^e Gouvernour & Leiuten^t of Mariland

Whereas upon th^e surrender of th^e Gouvernm^t to me his Lo^{ps} Leiutenant
on th^e 24th of March last, amongst other things, It was then
agreed th^t th^e oath of Fidellity should not be pressed upon th^e Inhabitants
then resideinge wthin this Prouince, But th^t in place & stead
