The Plan^t in his Petⁿ moues, that he is Scandilized by the Deff^t, & requires prooffe thereof or otherwise punishm^t of th^c Def^t accordinge to Law & Justice The defend^t produceth euidence & proues th^t Cap^t Thō Bradnox swore diuers Oathes & Cap^t Bradnox confest th^t it was in his Passion.

The Court proceed to order M^r Hen. Morgan doth Judge th^e Plan^t to pay two hundred Pounds of Toḅ. m^r Wickes Doth Judge th^t in regard it is the second offence & Conuiction in Court shall pay three hundred Pounds of Toḅ, beinge accordinge to Law or Acte of Assembly: M^r Phiff Conner doth Judge that th^e Plan^t shall paye two hundred Pounds. Cap^t Rob^t Vaughan Judge of th^e Court hauinge th^e Castinge vote doth Judge the same wth m^r Wickes beinge three hundred Pounds of Toḅ one moiety to th^e Lord Prop^r the other halfe to th^e Informer
