Whearas upon the 27th Day of Aperell 1660 theare wase a bill past Joyntly or seuerally to Thomas Wetherly for fue Thousand pounds of tobaco for a plantation we Do both of us agre and owne that nither of us upon Marriag or any Disagreinge shall in any wise sell or bartere the plantation to no other but that we shall piche a price leue or take upon forfeite of all the Estate that shall or should be parted at the Day of Marrage but in Case Deth before Marrage then we do both of us agree that theare shall neuer no other will be made but he that shall liue longeste shall Inioy the whole Estate yett upon the Day of Marriage of Ither of us the Estate shall be Equially Deuided betwen us vewed by two men of ither of us on Chusinge for any land it shall be sould to no other mane without the Consent of us boath and to the trew performance hearof we haue both sett oure hands beinge the 28 Day of Aperell 1660 yett if as for any bill or bills that hath binne past seuerally we both of us do owne that Ither of us is bound to the Debts as well as on
