The plaintiffe hauinge made appeare to th^e Cou^{rt} by suffisient Euidence that there is Justly due to him, out of the Estate of Gyles Bleak Foure thousand pounds of tobacc^o,

The Cou^{rt} doth therefore Order that p^rsent payment shall bee made out of the Estate of Gyles Bleake desseased Foure thousand pounds of Tobacc^o and Caske to the said m^r Thomas Cole els Execution


The depposition of W^m Price aged 30 yeares or thereabouts taken in Cou^{rt} th^e first of May 1656 sworn Examined & saith

That m^r Hinson Came to yo^r deponent about an hower within night, & desired him & John Salter to prisse twoe Cowes & a yearlinge heifer, w^{ch} belonged to m^r Brounes Estate, & at th^t p^rsent wee beeinge by th^e fire side, in Salters house m^r Hinson Askt us if wee knew th^e Cattell; & when wee saw them; & yo^r deponent ans^{rs} th^t hee saw th^m not since sunday last, & then th^e weare well, & heareupon hee gaue us o^r Oath, by th^e firesid, & then appointed us to goe forth together and prisse th^m, to th^e best of o^r knowledge, and wee prissed th^e twoe Cowes at Eleuen hundred and th^e heiffer at twoe hundred; & further saith not;

The depposition of Jn^o Salter aged 32 yeares or thereabouts taken in Cou^{rt} th^e first of May 1656 sworne examined & saith

The same verbatim exprest in th^e fore goinge depposition only expected that wheareas W^m Price hath this Expression, th^t hee sawe th^m not since sunday last; but yo^r deponent Concerninge seeinge of th^m, had not seene th^e Cattell of a longe tyme beefore, but m^r Hinson sayd th^e Cowes weare those twoe Cowes, th^t yo^r deponent had in his possession th^e last sumer & further saith not;
