The deposition of Ritchard Blunt aged 35 ye^{rs} or thereabouts
 taken in th^e p^rsents of m^r Tho: Hinson, Sworne Examined & saith

That about th^e begininge of Aprill last past, beeing at th^e house
 of m^r Iliue m^r South bought of m^r Iliue th^t plantacon th^t hee liues
 upon, for foure thousand pounds of to^b & Caske, which to^b was
 by th^e sd Iliue accepted in bills and m^r Iliue & Henery Clay weare
 to make theire Cropps upon it only th^t p^rsent ye^r; And th^e sd m^r
 Iliue desired secessie of yo^r deponent & those th^t weare p^rsent
 because hee had Engagd himselfe to m^r south, to bye Zacherie
 Wades part, as soone as hee Could send or goe; For th^t if this
 bargaine of sale should bee knowen, to Wade, beefore hee met
 with him or sent to him; th^t then Wade would make him pay th^e
 more for his part And th^t if this land was Recouered away From
 Iliue within a yeare so th^t hee Could not make good th^e salle to
 m^r south then the bargaine to bee void & of none effect & m^r South
 to haue his to^b with Cask Returnd to him againe, which th^e supposed
 would beefore th^t tyme bee made an End of off, one way or other; &
 furth^r saith not Sign~ Ritch~ **B.** Blunt

The deposition of m^r Thomas South aged 38 ye^{rs} or thereabouts
 taken in th^e p^rsents of m^r Thomas Hinson (upon Kent) sworne
 Exam~ & saith

That about March last, yo^r deponent & Ritchard Blunt bought a
 plantacon of m^r Thomas at Siuerne (th^t hee was then Seated upon)
 as doth plainly appeare, by a bill of salle under m^r Thomas his
 hand, The bounds of which land m^r Thomas made knowen to us by
 word of mouth, as followeth; Bounded one way, with th^e meeteing
 house path or it went as fare as th^e Meeteinge house path, but hee
 neuer understood th^t it Exceeded that; And bounded licke wise to
 a valley in th^e way to m^r Owines, where th^e fence Ran & yo^r
