This Indenture made th<sup>e</sup> Eighteenth day of July in th<sup>e</sup> five and  
 Thirtyeth yeare of the Dominion of the R<sup>t</sup> Hono<sup>ble</sup> Caecilius Absolu-  
 tute Lord & Prop<sup>ty</sup> of the Province of Maryland Lord Baron of Balte-  
 more & in the yeare of our Lord God One thousand six hundred Sixty  
 and sixe Betweene John Burridge of Ann Arrundell County w<sup>th</sup> in the  
 s<sup>d</sup> Province planter of the one parte & William Burges of th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup>  
 County of Ann Arrundell gent of the other parte wittneseth th<sup>t</sup>  
 whereas the s<sup>d</sup> Lord Baltimore by his Deed of Grant under his greate  
 Seale used in the said Province for granting of lands there bearing  
 date att St<sup>t</sup> Maries the Seaventeenth day of January in th<sup>e</sup> two &  
 thirtyeth yeare of his lo<sup>ps</sup> Dominion oū the s<sup>d</sup> province A<sup>o</sup>q̄ Domini  
 One thowsand six hundred fifty & eight Did for th<sup>e</sup> consideraōns  
 therein menōned Grant unto John Boague of Patuxent Planter  
 by the name of John Boague All th<sup>t</sup> parcell of land called Boagely  
 lying on th<sup>e</sup> East side of a river running out of the Easterne bay called  
 Chester River & on th<sup>e</sup> South side of a creeke in the said river called  
 Coursica creeke beginning att a marked oke standing on th<sup>e</sup> East  
 side of a branch called Boagues next to th<sup>e</sup> land lately laid out for  
 Robert Mackline running East North East up the creeke for bredth  
 one hundred seaventy five p̄ches to a m̄ked oke by a pond side next  
 to th<sup>e</sup> creeke bounding on th<sup>e</sup> East by a line drawne South from the  
 said oke for length Three hundred & twenty perches on th<sup>e</sup> Sowth  
 by a line drawne west sowth west from the End of th<sup>e</sup> south line One  
 hundred seaventy five perches untill itt intersect a paralell drawne [p. 415]  
 from Boages branch on the west with th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> branch & paralell on th<sup>e</sup>  
 south with the said creeke conteyning & then Laid out for Three  
 hundred & fifty acres To have & to hold th<sup>e</sup> same unto him th<sup>e</sup> said  
 John Boague his heires & assignes for ever und<sup>r</sup> such rents Covenants  
 Limitaōns & excepōns as in & by the said Deed of grant rela-  
 tōn being thereunto had more att Large itt doth & may appeare  
 All w<sup>ch</sup> s<sup>d</sup> lands before menōned by seūall meane assign<sup>ts</sup> as since  
 come unto th<sup>e</sup> said Burridge Now this Indenture wittneseth That  
 the said John Burridge for & in consideraōn of Six Thousand  
 pounds of tobacco to him in hand p<sup>d</sup> by the s<sup>d</sup> William Burges before  
 the Ensealing & deliūy hereof whereof and wherew<sup>th</sup> th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> John
