unto yo^r Hono^{rs} That yo^r Peti^{coner} beinge an Evidence in Aprill Co^{rt} last ag^t Francis Kilbourne & Others about Hogstealinge, & yo^r Peti^{coner} Incurringe the displeasure of the Co^{rt} Was bound to the good behaviour, & to appeare att the then Co^{rt} which beinge Adjorned yo^r Peti^{coner} now Accordinge to his Bond makes his Appearance att this Co^{rt} to his very greate Trouble & Damage.

Yo^r Peti^{coner} humbly prayes that yo^r Hono^{rs} would be Graciously pleased to Discharge yo^r Peti^{coner} from his said Bond, That he may Retorne Home to his Occasions And yo^r peti^{coner} as in Duty Bound shall Ever pray &c.

The Peti^{con} above men^{coned} was Read, and the said James Mecall in Open Co^{rt} was Freed discharged and Cleared by Proclamacon, December the 14th 1670

Uppon Readinge of the Petition of william Dorrington & Bartholomew Ennalls heere in Co^{rt} p^rsented to th^e Hono^{ble} the Leiften^t Gen^{ll} &c, They beinge Sum^{oned} to Serve on the Grand Jury this Co^{rt} & they not Appearinge weere Each of them Fyned Five Hundred poundes of Tobaccoe apeece
