The House met according to Adjournment: The Members were called, and all appeared as Yesterday, except Mr. John Goldsborough, Mr. Edmondson, Mr. Thomas, Mr. Sulivane, Mr. Edward Tilghman, Mr. Wright, Mr. Earle, Mr. Ringgold, Mr. Paca, and Mr. Hammond. The Proceedings were Read.

On Motion, Ordered, That the Accounts of the Sums of Money received and applied by the Agents, in Pursuance of the Act for granting a Supply of Forty Thousand Pounds for his Majesty's Service, and striking £34015:6:0 thereof in Bills of Credit, and Raising a Fund for sinking the same, be delivered to the said Agents, to be laid before the Upper House of Assembly, for their Inspection and Examination.

The Petition of Jonas Green, of the City of Annapolis, Printer, was Read the second Time:

Ordered, That Mr. Dulany, Mr. John Hall, Mr. Johnson, Mr. Grahame, Mr. Gantt, and Mr. Allen, be a Committee to enquire into the Facts set forth in the said Petition.
