We herewith return you the Bill Entituled an Act for the Speedy Recovery of Small Debts out of Court before One Justice of the Peace.

We agree to your first Amendment but cannot agree to the provisoes you would have inserted for granting an appeal to the County Courts in the full extent of your amendment as we apprehend it would in great measure defend the speedy Recovery of Small Debts the main end of that Bill

Yet we are willing to grant an appeal in the manner you have pointed out where the Debt exceed thirty three Shillings and four pence Current Money or four hundred pounds of Tobacco and hope for the Concurrence of your House to this so just and reasonable a proposal
