By the Upper House of Assembly 23.^d November 1763

Gentlemen

The Fate of the Bill we this Morning returned to You making it necessary that many Additions be made to the Journal of Accounts so that all who have just Claims on the Publick may be Satisfied we sent You back the Journal for that Purpose, Should You resolve after such Additions have been made to let Us have it again this Session we hope you will send it Up as soon as Possible that we may have time to examine it for as we Perceive You have not made the Clerk of the Council the usual allowance a Point this House will ever insist on we are apprehensive some other just Claims have been disregarded and therefore shall not pass it without a Carefull Examination, Should You think it reather too late in the session to make the necessary Additions to the Journal at Present you will we hope enter on it early in the next session so that this House may have sufficient time to examine it and to look into the Several Vouchers which You will at the same time be Pleased to send Us.
