In Answer to your Message of yesterday, attending your Negative to our Bill for continuing the Act, Ent.d An Act for amending the Staple of Tobacco, for preventing frauds in his Majestys Customs, and for the limitation of Officers ffees, we beg leave to inform you that we do not chuse to enter into a Conference upon the General Subject of a new Inspection Law, as you seem to desire, some of your Amendments & Alterations, when proposed, we may possibly incline to come into otherwise may resolve totally to reject, and others to debate upon, so that it appears to us a more eligible method of proceeding, for your honours to point out by way of Message, the Alterations & amendments you think expedient, which may probably either make a Conference unnecessary, or reduce the Subject of it to a few explicit Points, and of Course render the Debates upon the point of Difference more short and easy, We would therefore request your Honours to make us acquainted with the Alterations and Amendments you incline to have made, that we may Consider of the Expediency of Entering into a debate thereupon.
