No. 13 An Act to Aid the Proceedings of the Vestry of S. t Stephens Parish in Cecil County [No. XIV]

[Passed 21st of November 1 [Preamble]

Whereas the Vestry men and Church Wardens of St Stephens Parish in Cecil County by their humble Petition to the General Assembly of this Province have set forth that the Vestry of that Parish were by means of the Small Pox raging in the Neighbourhood Prevented from meeting on Easter Monday in the Year of Lord Seventeen hundred and Sixty, to Elect Vestry Men and Church Wardens as by law they were Required Whereby they Apprehend their Proceedings as a Vestry since that Time are not legal and pray that their said Proceedings may be Aided and made Valid
