## LETTER FROM FREDERICK, LORD BALTIMORE, TO GOV. SHARPE, APRIL 22, 1762

[This letter, dated from London, April 22, 1762, INFORMED SHARPE THAT THE PROPRIETARY HAD PRE-SENTED TO THE KING AND QUEEN THE ADDRESS OF CON-DOLENCE AND CONGRATULATION OF THE GOVERNOR AND THE UPPER HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY UPON THE DEATH OF George II and the accession of George III to the THRONE. SEE PAGES XIVIII-XIIX FOR A DISCUSSION OF THIS ADDRESS WHICH HAD GIVEN RISE TO A BITTER CONTRO-VERSY BETWEEN THE TWO HOUSES AND THE ADOPTION BY EACH HOUSE OF SEPARATE AND DIFFERENT ADDRESSES TO THE KING. 1
