LETTER FROM FREDERICK, LORD BALTIMORE, TO
GOV. SHARPE, APRIL 22, 1762

[THIS LETTER, DATED FROM LONDON, APRIL 22, 1762, INFORMED SHARPE THAT THE PROPRIETARY HAD PRESENTED TO THE KING AND QUEEN THE ADDRESS OF CONDOLENCE AND CONGRATULATION OF THE GOVERNOR AND THE UPPER HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY UPON THE DEATH OF GEORGE II AND THE ACCESSION OF GEORGE III TO THE THRONE. SEE PAGES XLVIII-XLIX FOR A DISCUSSION OF THIS ADDRESS WHICH HAD GIVEN RISE TO A BITTER CONTROVERSY BETWEEN THE TWO HOUSES AND THE ADOPTION BY EACH HOUSE OF SEPARATE AND DIFFERENT ADDRESSES TO THE KING.]
