Therefore they pray that your Excellency will take the premises under your Consideration and that an Act of Assembly may be passed for Holding a Market in the said Town at the Market House upon Wednesdays and Saturdays in every week and for the Regulation of the said Market and so forth. and they will every pray & so forth
