The humble Address of the House of Delegates.

May it please your Excellency,

We, his Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Delegates of the Freemen of Maryland, in Assembly convened, return your Excellency our Thanks for your Speech at the Opening of this Session.

We shall immediately take the Matters recommended by your Excellency, into our most serious Consideration; and as we are under the strongest Obligations of Loyalty and Gratitude to the Best of Kings, and the Inducement of our own Interest, we are
