Ordered that M.^r Johnson M.^r H. Hall M.^r Hammond & M.^r Worthington do prepare & bring in a Bill according to the petitioners prayer

The Bill Entituled an Act for the Tryal of all Matters of Fact in the several Counties where they have arisen or shall arise was read the second Time and will pass and was sent to the Upper House by Col.^o Lloyd and M.^r Dent
