> By the Command of the House of Delegates of Maryland I am to inform you that Mess. rs Murdock Tilghman and Ringgold who were appointed by them a Committee to join Committees from the Houses of Representatives of the other British Colonies on the Continent of America at New York to consult together on the present Circumstances of the Colonies and the Difficulties to which they are and must be reduced by the Operation of the late Acts of Parliament for levying Duties and Taxes on the Colonies and to consider of a general and united dutiful loyal and humble Representation of their Condition to his Majesty and the Parliament and to implore Relief having laid the Proceedings of that Congress as well as a Copy of their Letter to you before the House of Delegates the Conduct of those Gentlemen hath been unanimously approved and the House are well pleased with their Choice of Mr Garth from whose Attachment to the General Interests of America (intimately connected with those of the Mother Country) and the common Rights of Fellow Subjects they hope the most happy Issue to your generous **Efforts**
