

No. 12 A Supplementary Act to the Act intituled an Act for Limitation of certain Action for avoiding Suits at Law. Liber H. S.

Whereas the Act intituled an Act for Limitation of Certain Actions for avoiding Suits at Law, hath provided that in case any Person or Persons whatsoever shall absent themselves out of this Province after any Debt contracted He she or they so absenting themselves shall have no Benefit by the Limitation or Restriction in the said Act Specified but hath made no provision in the Case wherein the Person or Persons liable to the Same hath or have been is are or may be absent out of the Province at the time when any Cause of Action may have arisen or accrued or Shall or may arise or accrue against him her or them tho the said Case falling under the same Reason ought to have the same Remedy

[Preamble, reciting Part of 1715, ch. 23]

Be it therefore Enacted By the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary By and with the advice and consent of his Lordships Governor and the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly and the Authority of the same, That if any Person or Persons liable or that hath or have been or shall or may be liable to any Action or that hath or have been or shall or may be absent out of this Province at the Time when the Cause of Action hath Arisen or accrued or shall or may arise or accrue against him her or them He she or They, shall have or receive no Benefit or Advantage of or from the said recited Act,

[Persons, absent, &c, to receive no advantage]

Provided that the Person or Persons that Hath have or Hath or have had or that shall or may have Such Cause of Action as afore-said shall commence or Prosecute the same after the presence in this Province of the Person or Persons liable thereto within the Time or Times limited in and by the said recited Act.

Whereas Ann Ogle of Annapolis Widow of Samuel Ogle Esquire Deceased. Benjamin Tasker Esquire and John Hammond Esquire have by their petition to this present General Assembly Set forth "that the said Samuel Ogle died Seized in fee of and in two Several Tracts of Land in Ann Arundel County called or known by the Names of Hickory Ridge and Green Land; the former containing two hundred and Sixty two Acres more or less, the latter one hundred Acres more or less: That Benjamin Ogle Son and Heir
