We herewith return you the Bill entitled an Act to prevent the Navigation on Potowmac River Monocasey and great Conicocheage Creeks being obstructed. It is represented to this House, that there is at present no Mill Dam of any Kind on either Monocasey or great Conicocheague Creek, except a Saw Mill Dam on Conicocheague, near its Mouth, and that the Builder of that Dam was by the Erection of it, a Trespasser on the Property of another, as that Dam if suffered to remain in its present State will entirely prevent Navigation on Conicocheague, & the Builder erected it, not only without any
 p. 233 Encouragement from our Laws in Being, but against Law, this House thought Him very Tenderly dealt with by this Bill, in only being obliged to make a sufficient Lock by the first Day of October next, in which private Interest and public Convenience are intended, as far as they can, to be reconciled We therefore hope that on reconsidering the Matter, the same Reasons, that influenced this House, will induce your Honours to wave your proposed Amendment.
