A Message by Mess.^{rs} Hammond and Ringgold

By The Lower House of Assembly 7 Dec.^r 1765

May it please your Honours.

This House hath agreed to make all the Allowances mentioned in your Message of the 5.th Ins.^t by Daniel Dulany Esquire, except those of 81,600^{lb} & 8,800^{lb} of Tobacco to the late and present Clerk of the Council. As it does not appear to this House, for what Services rendered to the Public these Sums are required to be paid we do not think we could be justified to our Constituents in making such Allowances; If those Gentlemen will lay before us a particular Account of their Charges for Services performed by Virtue of the Laws of this Province, and for which they ought to be paid by a Tax on the People, we will readily insert in the Journal what shall
