The Defend^t hereupon Craves an Appeale to th^e Provinciaall Court which is graunted

Ordered Therefore That th^e Plaintife be free unlesse th^e Def^t Prosecute th^e appeale and that th^e Defend^t satisfie and pay unto him either 10^{lb} Sterling or Corne, and Cloathes as in the act is provided w^{ch} he pleaseth wth Costs

Knowe all men by these presents That we James Lyndsey and James Macoy have received of m^r Stephen Montague Admin^r of th^e Estate of Captaine Robert Troop latelie dec^d a Pattent for th^e quantitie of five hundred Acres of Land lying upon the Anacostin called Scotland yard which the said Captain Troop bequeathed unto us th^e said James Lyndsey and James Macoy aforesaid, and to our heires for ever from w^{ch} Legacie we doe hereby acquitt and discharge the said Stephen Montague for ever In witnes whereof we have hereunto Set our hands and Seales this 13th Day of November 1667.

Francis Glyn Entereth th^e Marke of his Hogges and Cattle viz^t The Right eare Cropt overkeel^d and underkeeld and th^e Left eare Swallowe forked.

John Bond, and Edmund Lyndsey enter th^e marke of their Hogges and Cattle viz^t Cropt on th^e Right, underkeeld and a hole in th^e Left.

Whereas M^r James Lyndsey presented an Account of one Thousand two hundred and fourtie pounds of tobaccoe due unto him from Richard Randall latelie deceased for Physick th^t in his life time he had of him, and th^e Administrators of th^e Said Randall viz^t m^r Stephen Montague and M^r Joseph Harrison acknowledged a Judgment to M^r Lyndsey for th^e same It is Ordered That th^e said Montague and Harrison Satisfie and pay unto the said M^r Lyndsey the aforesaid Sume.

Thomas Henshall Sworne Saith That he Saw Arthur Turner latelie dec^d Signe a Bill produced in Court passed by the said Turner in his Life time to M^r Benjamin Rozer
