[p. 99] That Whereas for worke done for Captaine Rob. Troop he th^e s^d
 Troope stood endebted to your Peticon^r in th^e s^ume of 150^{lb} of
 tobacoe p̄ Bill he Therefore humblie Craves ord^r of Courte ag^t
 Stephen Montague and Ignatius Causeen as Admin^{rs} to th^e said
 Troope for his said debt And &c.

Whereupon th^e said Montague and Causeen acknowledge th^e said
 debt to be due and It is therefore Ordered th^t th^e said Montague
 and Causeen satisfie unto th^e Peticon^r th^e said debt of 150^{lb} of
 toba^c out of th^e estate of th^e said Captaine Rob. Troope dec^d

The Plaintiffes arresting th^e Defend^t in their a^con of debt upon
 acco^t to th^e value of 400^{lb} of tobacoe preferre their declara^con as
 followeth (viz^t)

To th^e Wor^{pl}e th^e Co^mission^{rs} of Charles Countie.

The Plaintiffes declare ag^t th^e Defend^t in their a^con of debt upon
 acco^t to th^e value of 400^{lb} of toba^c for th^t th^e Defend^t received goods
 of Elizabeth Lumbrozo then, nowe Elizabeth Brown: one of th^e
 Plaintiffes w^{ch} said goods amounted to th^e quantitie of toba^c they
 declare for as they can make appeare w^{ch} payment is by the Defend^t
 denyed Whereupon they bring their suite humblie Craveing ord^r
 of this Courte for their debt And &c.

Whereupon th^e Defend^t demandeth th^e Plaintife to prove his debt
 just and then he will Confesse a Judgment, and entereth th^e same
 as his plea.

[p. 100] Whereupon the Plaintife produceth his evidence Leonard Greene
 in confirma^con of his s^d Declara^con and in overthrowe of th^e
 Defend^{ts} plea

Leonard Greene being sworne in open Court saith That th^e
 Defend^t had as much ruⁿe and sugar at th^e Doctors house as came
 to between 3 or 400^{lb} of tobacoe and that th^e Def^t received it him-
 selfe about Julie An^o 1665 to th^e best of this Depon^{ts} remembrance;
 and this Depon^t further saith That he being accidentallie at D^r
 Lumbrozo^s house at th^e same time he was desired to enter th^e said
 debt in th^e D^{rs} Booke of acco^{ts} w^{ch} he did accordinglie And this
 Depon^t further saith not.

Whereupon the Courte demand the Plaintiffes to produce their
 Booke of acco^t w^{ch} they say they are not able to doe for th^t it is
 lost, and they knowe not what is become of it; The C^{rt} therefore
 hereupon adjudge th^e debt not justlie proved by one single evidence
