In a cause depending between George Godfrey Plaintiff and Rich^d Beck Def^t, th^e Plaintiff by his Attorney John Jones complaines ag^t the Def^t For that the s^d George Godfrey at the Speciall instance of him the s^d Rich^d did make and deliver two Sev^l Coffins for th^e desent buriall of the Father and Mother of him the s^d Rich^d at Sev^l tymes at the price of two hundred and fifty poundes of to^b: and also two payre of gloves to the value of Sixty poundes of to^b: and a payre of Shoes to the value of twenty & five poundes of to^b in all amounting to the Sum^e of three hundred thirty & five poundes of to^b: in considera^on whereof the Rich^d did promise to pay the s^d Sev^l Sum^es of to^b: notwthstanding the s^d Rich^d his promise little regarding but fraudulently intending the s^d George to deceive & deprive of the three hundred thirty and five p^ds of to^b though often thereunto required, hath refused and Still doth refuse to pay the Same to the s^d Geo: to his damage five hundred poundes of to^b whereupon he brings his Suite, & th^e s^d Geo: Proves his declara^on by the othes of Allexander Gallant and Ralph Coates whereupon it was ordred that judg^{mt} Should be entred ag^t the Def^t wth costs as follows

In a cause depending between George Godfrey Plaintiff and Allexander Sennet Def^t the Plaintiff by his Attorney Jn^o Jones declares ag^t th^e Defendant for th^t he by force and armes one young mare of the value of two thousand poundes of to^b of the pp goods of him the s^d George pastureing and Som tyme Since abideing in the woods he hath taken up and marked of his owne marke thereby endeavoureing to allter th^e pro^pty w^{ch} the s^d George hath in the s^d Mare contrary to the peace of the Right Hon^{ble} th^e Lord Proprietary &c and to the damage of him the s^d George three thousand poundes of to^b, whereupon he brings his Suite

And the Allexander Sennett by Samuell Cressy his Attorney comes and defends the force and injury when &c and Sayes that he is not
