other Receivers of his Majesty's said Revenue, but M. John L. H. J. Rousby, and M.r John Dansey, who act by the Authority of the Nov. 15 Government here, being appointed to those Offices, on the Death of George Plater, and George Muschampe Esq. rs formerly appointed to those Offices by the Crown; but since that his Majesty's Surveyor General has a particular Authority over the Officers of the Revenue here, and is now Daily expected, his Excellency will take Care on his Arrival, to settle this Matter with him. In the mean Time, he has given Orders to the several Clerks of the County Courts, to return him by the first of September next, an Account of all ffines and fforfeitures. M.r Dansey's Accounts of the Three pence per Hogshead for Arms, and of the ffines and fforfeitures are herewith sent you.
