The Bill, entitled, An Act to ease the Inhabitants of this Province and to empower the Justices of several Counties to bind out the Persons therein mentioned Apprentices; was read the second Time and will pass.

The Bill, entitled, An Act for the Security of Purchasers and others, being Protestants, claiming by or from Aliens; was read the second Time, and passed; Both Bills were sent to the Upper House, by M.^r Earle and M.^r Harris.

The Bill, entitled, An Act to aid defective Common Recoveries Was read the second Time, and will pass, and was sent to the Upper House by M.^r Selby, and M.^r Jacob. p. 464
