Gentlemen,

N.º 13. An Act continuing an Act, entitled, An Act for imposing an additional Duty of two Pounds per Poll, on all Negroes imported into this Province.

N.º 14. An Additional Supplementary Act to the Act, entitled An Act for quieting Possessions, enrolling Conveyances, and securing the Estates of Purchasers.

N.º 15. An Act to ease the Inhabitants of this Province, and to empower the Justices of the several Counties to bind out the Persons therein mentioned, Apprentices.

N.º 16. An Act for the speedy and effectual Publication of the Laws of this Province, and for the Encouragement of Jonas Green, of the City of Annapolis, Printer

N.º 17. A Supplementary Act, to the Act, entitled, An Act to prevent the Mischiefs arising from the Multiplicity of useless Dogs, and for other Purposes therein mentioned
