The Bill, entitled, An Act to prevent the Exportation of Flour, Staves, &^{ta} from Baltimore Town, in Baltimore County, &^{ta} was referred to the Consideration of next Assembly.

In Progression of reading the second Time, the Bill, entitled, An Act for amending and repairing the Public Roads in Baltimore County.

On Motion of Capt. Cockey Deye, That a Duty be laid on Pig and Bar Iron exported out of Baltimore County, towards defraying the Expence of keeping the Public Roads, in that County, in Repair. The Question was put, Whether a Clause should be inserted in the Bill for that Purpose, or not? The House being divided on the aforegoing Question, it was determined in the Negative, by the Honourable Speaker.
