Ordered that Daniel Chamier, the sheriff of Baltimore County, have notice given him by the serjeant at arms, to attend the hearing of the said petition; and that the clerk do make out a copy of this order, and of the petition to be sent to the sheriff

Ordered that the clerk do make out all such summonses as shall be applied for by any of the parties
