The bill entitled an act to prevent the exportation of flour, staves, and shingles, not merchantable, from the town of Baltimore in Baltimore County, and to regulate the weight of hay and measure of grain, salt flax-seed, and fire-wood within the said town, was read the second time. The question was put, whether the said bill do pass? Resolved in the affirmative
