Mr. Sullivane brings in and delivers to M.^r speaker, the ingrossed bill entitled and act for granting to the Nanticoke indians a compensation for the lands therein mentioned: Which is read and assented to, and sent to the upper house by M.^r Thomas and M.^r Purnel.

The petition of sundry freeholders, and free-voters of Ann Arundel County, complaining of an undue election therein, was read and rejected for the uncertainty thereof

M.^r Chase brings in and delivers to M.^r speaker a bill entitled an act for the relief of the poor within the several Counties therein mentioned.

M.^r Hall brings in and delivers to M.^r speaker, a bill entitled an act for amending and declaring the law in the cases therein mentioned.

M.^r Sullivane brings in and delivers to M.^r speaker, a bill entitled a supplementary act to the act entitled, an act to establish a road from Hunting Creek in Dorchester County to Dover in Talbot County.

M.^r Hayward brings in and delivers to M.^r speaker, a bill entitled an act confirming to Spedding Bromwell of Talbot County certain lots of land therein mentioned.
