The governor communicated to M.<sup>r</sup> speaker, the following message  
Gentlemen of the lower house of assembly,

I am desired by M.<sup>r</sup> Samuel Carrick of Frederick County, to recommend it to you, to make him an allowance for sundry provisions by him furnished, to parties of militia, that were in actual service on the frontiers during the late war; and for services performed there by himself as stated in the inclosed account; which he tells me is a copy of one heretofore laid before the committee of
