PETITION, DATED MAY 16, 1767, FROM THE VESTRY OF COVENTRY PARISH OF WORCESTER COUNTY TO GOVERNOR HORATIO SHARPE IN REGARD TO THE APPOINTMENT OF A NEW RECTOR FOR THAT PARISH

[THIS PETITION, DATED MAY 16, 1767, TO SHARPE FROM THE VESTRY OF COVENTRY PARISH, SIGNED BY 183 PARISHIONERS INCLUDING 6 VESTRYMEN AND 2 CHURCH WARDENS, CALLS ATTENTION TO THE "LONG PERISHING STATE" OF THE PARISH AS THE RESULT OF THE DELINQUENCIES OF THE FORMER RECTOR, THE REVEREND NATHANIEL WHITAKER, PRAYS THAT NO RECTOR "BE IMPOSED" ON THE PARISH WITHOUT ITS APPROBATION, AND REQUESTS THE INDUCTION OF THE REVEREND DOCTOR THOMAS BRADLEY CHANDLER.
