The Jurours for the Right honoble the Lord Proprietary upon their oathes doe preent Justinian Gerard of the County of St Maryes for that the said Justinian Gerard Two hoggs of the goods and Chattells of John Gouldsmith of the County of St Maryes at Bramley in the aforesayd County did take Kill and carry away the fifth day of October in the fortieth yeare of his Lopps Dominion &c Annoque Domini 1671, Contrary to the forme and Effect of a certeine Act of Assembly in that case had made and provided and against the peace of his said Lopos Rule and Dignity.
