Which Pattent is since come to bee y<sup>e</sup> Right of y<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Henry Ellery by marrying the s<sup>d</sup> Elizabeth, the Relict of Will<sup>m</sup> Stephenson deceased.
