And whereupon the ſaid Andrew by Charles Boteler his Attorney
ſaith, That whereas the ſaid Thomas Bankes upon the two & twen-
tieth day of May in the yeare of our Lord One thouſand ſix hun-
dred ſeventy & foure by his certaine bond or writing Obligatory
which he the ſaid Andrew Tenehill with the Seale of the ſaid
Thomas Bankes ſigned here in Court produceth whoſe date is the
day & yeare aforesaid, was holden & firmly bounden unto Andrew
Tenehill Merchant or to his lawfull Attorney in the full & neat
quantity of Eighteen thouſand two hundred ſixty & ſix pounds of
good ſound M^rchantable tobacco & caſke To the which payment
well & truely to be made the ſaid Thomas Bankes did binde himſelſe
his heyres Ex^{rs} & Ad^{rs} firmly by thoſe p^rſents Notwithſtanding
which the ſaid Thomas Bankes though often thereunto required
the ſaid ſume of Eighteen thouſand two hundred ſixty & ſix pounds
of tobacco hath not paid unto the ſaid Andrew Tenehill, but the
ſame hitherto hath denyed to render & as yet doth deny whereupon
the ſaid Andrew ſaith he is damnified & hath loſſe to the Value
of twenty five thouſand pounds of tobacco, & thereupon he brings
his ſuite

And the ſaid Thomas by George Parker his Attorney comes &
defends the force & injury when &c and pray heareing of the ſaid
writing, & itt is read unto him, he alſo prayeth heareing of the
Condicōn of the ſaid writing & itt is read unto him in theſe words
following The Condicōn of this Obligacon is ſuch, That if the above
bounden Tho: Bankes his heyres Ex^{rs} & Adm^{rs} ſhall well & truely
pay or cauſe to be paid unto the ſaid Andrew Tenehill his heyres
