Which peticōn being read & heard the said Mary Eaton appeares by Kenelm Cheseldyn her Attorney, and saith that she hath nothing to say in barr but that judgem<sup>t</sup> be entred upp against the Estate of the said Jeremiah Eaton for the aforesaid Sume of tenn Thousand pounds of tobacco Therefore itt is considered by the Court here this day to witt the ffourteenth day of March in the fourth year of the Dominion of Charles Lord Baltmore &c Annoq̄ Doni 1678 that the said William Vaughan recover against the Estate of the said Jeremiah Eaton the aforesaid sume of tenn thousand pounds of tobacco
