And whereupon the said John by Robert Carvile his Attorney saith, that whereas the said Thomas & Samuell upon the nineteenth day of Novemb<sup>r</sup> Anno Doni One thousand six hundred Seventy two by their certaine bond or writeing obligatory sealed with the Seales of them the said Thomas & Samuel & here in Court produced whose date is the day & yeare abovesaid, did confesse & acknowledge them to be held & firmly bound unto the said John Shelton in the su<sup>m</sup>e of Twenty foure pounds of good & lawfull money of England to be paid to the said John Shelton his certaine Attorney Exec<sup>rs</sup> Adm<sup>rs</sup> or assignes, to which paym<sup>t</sup> well & truely to be made they bound themselves & either of them their heyres Ex<sup>rs</sup> & Adm<sup>rs</sup> joyntly & severally in the whole & every part firmly by those p<sup>r</sup>sent Yet notwithstanding the said Thomas & Samuell nor either of them the said Su<sup>m</sup>e of twenty foure pounds of lawfull money of England according to the tenour of the said bond to him the said John Shelton though often thereunto requested haue not paid or satisfied, but the same to pay & Satisfie have hitherto & still doe deny & refuse to pay the same to the da<sup>m</sup>age of the said John Shelton thirty pounds sterling and thereupon he bringeth his suite

And the said Thomas Hedge by John Blomfield his Attorney cometh & defendeth the force & injury when &c & prayeth the hearing of the writing aforesaid & itt is read unto him, he also prayeth the hearing of the Condiço<sup>n</sup> of the writeing aforesaid & itt is read unto him in these words The Condiço<sup>n</sup> of this Obligac<sup>o</sup>n is such, that if the above bounden Thomas Hedge or Samuell Hedge or either of them their or either of their heyres Exec<sup>rs</sup> or Adm<sup>rs</sup> shall & doe well & truely pay or cause to be paid unto the above named John Shelton his Exec<sup>rs</sup> Adm<sup>rs</sup> or assignes the full Su<sup>m</sup>e of twelve pounds sterling of good & lawfull money of England on the nineteenth day of May in the yeare One thousand six hundred seventy & three, then this
