 day of June in the fourth yeare of the Dominion of Charles Lord  
 Baltamore &c Annoq<sup>3</sup> Doni 1679 to Answer unto Robert Ridgely  
 gentl one of the Attorneys of this Court who for the said Lord  
 Prop<sup>ty</sup> in this behalfe Prosecuteth in a plea of trespas upon the case  
 On which said third day of June in the yeare aforesaid the same  
 Sheriffe made returne of the writt afforesaid, that by vertue thereof  
 he hath Attached all the Goods & Chattles in his bailywick belong-  
 ing to the said John Longden which he hath caused to be valued &  
 appraised by John Osborne & Stephen Horsey good & lawfull men  
 of his bailywick, who Appraise the same att Seventeen pounds five  
 shillings & Eight pence A Schedule of which is annexed to the said  
 writt under the hands of the said Appraisers, other Goods & Chattles  
 of the said John Longden he could not finde in his bailywick
