Now here att this day to witt the ffifteenth day of Octobr in the third yeare of the Dominion of Charles Lord Baltemore &c Annoq̄ Doni 1678 came Samuell Graves & Alice his wife Symon Edwards & Susanna his wife Executrices of the last Will & testament of the said Demetrius Cartwright by Charles Boteler their Attorney And the said Thomas Mountford by his said Attorney likewise came And the said Thomas being present in Court made itt appeare to the Court here that he hath satisfied & paid unto the said Demetrius in his life tyme ffourteen hundred pounds of tobacco in part of satisfaction of the judgem^t aforesaid And saith nothing to preclude the said plaintiffes from haveing their Execucōn for the remainder of the judgem^t aforesaid Therefore itt is considered by the Court here that the said plaintiffes have their Eecucōn against the said Defend^t for the sume of ffoure thousand six hundred Eighty three pounds of tobacco the remainder of the judgem^t aforesaid together with three hundred & Eight pounds of tobacco cost of suite And also ffive hundred Seventy foure pounds of tobacco costs of suite sithence laid out and expended

And whereupon the said Richard Loyd by Kenelm Cheseldyn his Attorney complaineth, that whereas in the Act of Assembly by an Assembly held att the City of S^t Maryes in the yeare of the Dominion Of Cecilius in the yeare of our Lord One thousand six hundred & fifty & amongst other things itt was Enacted, p. 722
 that every person or persons that shall transport or carry away or cause to be transported or carried away any freeman out of this Province that is or shall be indebted or engaged here shall be lyable to pay & satisfie all such debts engagem^{ts} & dañages to the person or persons to whom the same shall be due respectively within this Province, unlesse the same be satisfied in convenient tyme, or that in a short tyme he procure such person or persons to returne againe into this Province whereby he may be lyable to Justice here Notwithstanding which the said W^m Singleton not being ignorant of the p^rmisses & the said Act of Assembly little weighing nor any way fearing the penalty in the same contained, but maliciously meaning & intending contrary to the forme of the said Act the said Richard Loyd to deceive & defraud of a certaine debt of two thousand pounds of tobacco did the sixth day of April in the yeare of our Lord One thousand six hundred Seventy six carry away & transport out of this Province one Clary Holboard relict of Joseph Holboard deceased who in his life tyme stood indebted unto the said Richard Loyd by
