

Liber W. C. Nov<sup>r</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> 1680

Now here at this day to witt the thirtyeth day of Novemb<sup>r</sup> in the fifth yeare of the dominion of the R<sup>t</sup> hono<sup>ble</sup> Charles Lord Baltimore &c Anno<sup>q</sup> Dom 1680. the said accon being solemnly called & noe pson appeareing to defend y<sup>e</sup> p<sup>r</sup>misses

Whereupon the said ffrancis Billingsley by George Parker his Attorney aforesaid in the behalfe of the Lesso<sup>r</sup> James Pascall prayed that Judgm<sup>t</sup> might bee Awarded by default & also his Lo<sup>pps</sup> writt to Cause him to have possession of the p<sup>r</sup>misses. And It is granted unto him accordingly

And Whereupon the said John by Robert Carvile his Attorney sayeth that Whereas the said George Upon the Twentyeth day of November in the yeare of our Lord 1679 Att Portobacco Creeke in Charles County in the said Province with force & Armes the Close of him the said John did breake & three Trees then and there growing of his the said John Did fell Cutt downe & Carry away to the Vallue of fifteen hundred pounds of Tobacco, & other harmes to him did to the Damage of the said John & against the Peace **Whereupon** hee sayth he is damnified & hath Losse to the Vallue of three thousand pounds of Tobacco & thereupon hee bringeth his suite

And the said George Godfrey by Robert Ridgely his Attorney Cometh & defendeth the force and Injury when &c and prayeth liberty to imparle hereunto untill next Prov<sup>l</sup> Court & It is granted unto him the same day is given to the plt also :

p. 257 Att w<sup>ch</sup> said next Provinciaall Court Came the said partyes by their Attorneys aforesaid & the said George George Godfrey by his said Attorney sayth that of the Trespasse above by the p<sup>l</sup>t Imposed upon him hee is in nothing thereof guilty in Manner and forme as the said p<sup>l</sup>t above against him hath Complained and of this hee puts himself Upon y<sup>e</sup> Country

Whereupon this Court pceiving it Very Necessary the better to find out by whome the Trespasse aforesaid is Committed, that the plantiffes Land be Surveyed and Laid out by some Skilfull pson according to the Meets & bounds Menconed in the Pattent & that a faire Plott and Certificate thereof bee returned unto the Next Provinciaall Court Did thereupon Order that Randolph Brandt, Gentl bee and is Especially appointed Impowered & Comanded to Lay out the afor<sup>d</sup> pcell of Land of the aforesaid John Lemarre Lyeing on the West side of S<sup>t</sup> Thomas's Creeke in Charles County aforesaid according to the ancient meets & bounds thereof in the p<sup>r</sup>sence of William Chandler Sheriffe of the County aforesaid Who
