The prmisses considered yor petr doth humbly begg an order of yor Lordpp & Hon<sup>ble</sup> Councell to his Honor the secretary for the issueing forth of a writt of Error & supersedeas of the judgment aforesaid to be argued before the upper house att the next Gen<sup>11</sup> Assembly according to the above order And as in duty bound he shall pray &c.
