That the said Treasurer pay to Richard Johns for the use of Robert Cable Seventeen pounds, ten shillings Current Money for the like sum paid by him on two Special Warrants of 3d. April 1782 to affect the Reserves in Baltimore County.

Sir,

Charles Ridgely Esqr. has offered to sell the State one hundred tons of Pig Iron delivered at Fells point, at Eleven pounds per Tun paiable in three years bearing an Annual Interest of Eight per Cent. I think the purchasing of this Iron may be of considerable advantage to the State by shipping it to London. Mr. Wallace and Company have offered to take it free of freight, if the Ships they expect, arrive safe, and to allow me to draw Bills at Five pounds
