buying ten bushels of Bran without leave or licence from his said Master and it being represented by six of the Justices of the said County that it appeared upon the testimony that the said James Bannister did not know at the time of his dealing with him the said William Donnelly that he was a Servant, that the said William Donnelly was a Miller placed and licenced to act as such by his said Master, and the Defendant was not acquainted personally with him, that it also appeared upon the evidence that the Defendant bought One bushel of Bran of the said Servant, That the fine by law is 2000 lbs. of Tobacco, and in case of incapacity to pay the same, thirty Lashes on the Bare back is imposed, and the said Justices having recommended him the said James Bannister as a proper Object of Clemency, It is hereby directed that the said fine of 2000 lbs. of Tobacco be remitted.
