that She was presented to the last January term of Baltimore County Court for selling Spiritous Liquors without Licence, and fined in the Amount [p 311] of six hundred weight of Tobacco. The Petitioner alleges that she was compelled by the distress of a Family of small Children to commit the offence, and professes herself wholly unable to pay the fine, and five of the Justices of Baltimore County having recommended her as an object worthy of relief, the Board in consideration of her poverty do hereby direct that the aforesaid fine of 600 Wt. of Tobacco be remitted.
