Christopher Green of Kent County by his Petition [p 313] sets forth that he has committed an assault and Battery for which he was fined five pounds Current Money and that on his non payment he was at the last March term of the Court of the said County committed to the public jail where he still remains. The Petitioner alleges that he was impelled by much provocation to commit the aforesaid Offence. He sets forth that he is utterly unable to pay the fine and that he has a Wife and two small Children, who are now Suffering extremely for want of his assistance. The Board considering his inability to pay the fine or any part thereof of which they are possessed of good information, and adverting to the confinement he has undergone, which they hope may have a good effect on his future conduct,
