It appears from transcripts from the Clerk of the County that she was fined last June term six hundred pounds of Tobacco and thirty shillings currency, and from the recommendation of four of the Justices of the said Court, that the Petitioner is unable to pay the said fines and Costs, and a number of the Inhabitants of the said County having signed the Petition, the Board in consideration of the low Circumstances of the Petitioner do direct a Remission of six hundred pounds of Tobacco, one of the said fines, which is hereby done.
