October 6th. 1787. John Edward Ford of Charles County for a tract of Land called Poppleton, in said County, or so much as was formerly the property of Eleanor Hubbard,

December 22 1787. Randolph Brandt Latimer for 3930 Acres of Land lying in Washington County formerly the property of the Rev'd. Mr. Boucher,
