Henry Jackson against the Same for Seventy three pounds four shillings and eleven pence; Stephen Miller against the same for Thirty nine pounds three shillings and three pence; and Jacob Ransburg against the same for Twenty seven pounds ten shillings. Which Accounts are rejected, because Mr. Dulany had contracted with Mr. Anderson for the building his House by whom all Contracts were made and to whom Application must be made for Payment and it appearing that Mr. Dulany fully paid Anderson.

On Considering the Justices Return of the Election for Sheriffs of Cæcil County, and Letters from sundry, Inhabitants of said County complaining that the sd. Election was not made fairly and agreeable to the Constitution, and requesting [p 66] to have an hearing before the Governor and Council, Ordered Thursday the third Day of November next be appointed for hearing and enquiring into the Same, and that the Parties attend on that Day with their Witnesses, and that Summons's issue when applied for.
