The Petitioner suggests that Jordan was not dissatisfied with the Charge; but was put upon presenting him by a certain Peter Carroll, to whom he casually mentioned the Circumstance, and who threatned him with a [p 82] Presentment in case he did not present the Petitioner. On considering the Circumstances mentioned and a Recommendation from three Magistrates of the said County, which accompanies the Petition, the Board do order and direct that the fine imposed in consequence of the said Presentment be remitted.
